Why a forum?

The purpose of the forum is two-fold. First, importantly, it will serve as an opportunity for those providing and administering rental housing in Vancouver to share and discuss the range of issues, problems, and solutions that proceed from their perspectives on the current crisis around adequate housing in Vancouver. Second, the forum will provide the Housing Justice Project with key insights into creative thinking about reform of housing policy and law necessary to addressing the shortage of adequate housing in Vancouver. Discussion points from this forum will inform the Project's research going forward and will be used in the development of policy alternatives for Municipal, Provincial and Federal levels of government.
